## Sunshine Quilting News

To update you on what has been accomplished in the Sunshine Quilt department, here is a brief report.

Since the start of our membership year at the beginning of September, we have been able to donate a total of 34 quilts. This includes: 4 to victims of fire; 23 to Clark Residential Care, Squier House, Greensboro Nursing Home and "Out and About"; 1 to be raffled for Lamoille Valley Foster and Adoptive Family Association; and 6 to individuals who either are very ill or otherwise known to be in need of some support. There are several more groups we support that we hope to be able to give some quilts soon.

We completed 24 quilts at the workshop on Nov. $13^{\text {th }}$, and will schedule another workshop when we have enough tops ready to be processed into quilts. There are about 17 kits currently signed out, and when turned in along with other donated tops there will certainly be enough for another work day to be scheduled! There will still be kits available at the next meeting if you would like to make one/another. (If anyone has any black fabric, either plain or with a small or black on black design, we could use some for the black strips used in the kits.)

Thanks to everyone who participates in this project in one way or another. Members help in any number of ways such as: donating fabric, cutting squares, assembling kits, making tops, sewing on borders, attending workshops, machine quilting tops, suggesting recipients, and delivering quilts. It is so successful because of the high participation of so many of you who donate whatever time you can. Thank you all, the quilts are deeply appreciated by those who receive them!

## 2009-2010 Block of the Month

This year the Block of the Month will be done as Mystery Quilts. In order to enjoy the "Mystery" part, please complete each part each month (no peeking ahead!). To start the year off there are two different Mystery Quilts: Mystery Quilt \#1 will be 56 " x 68 " when completed. Mystery Quilt \#2 will be 51" x 51 " when completed. ## Mystery Quilt \#2

PART 4 - DANCING AROUND THE SQUARE (this is Block B)

OK now on to Block B, so get out all the fabrics cut for this block.

Step 1: In Part 3, you drew a line from the top left corner to the bottom right corner on the wrong side of all light 2$7 / 8$ " squares. We are going to do the same thing with the 16 light squares you cut for Block B.


Step 2: Layer a light 2-7/8" square on a dark $2-7 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square, right sides together. Sew a $1 / 4$ " seam on EACH side of the line. Cut apart on the line and press seam toward the dark fabric. Trim points. Repeat 15 more times for a total of 32 light/dark half-square triangles.


Step 3: Using a pencil and ruler, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of all medium 2.5" squares as shown below:


Step 4: Place a medium $2.5^{\prime \prime}$ square on the right end of a dark $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle (right sides together) as shown below. Stitch a seam on the diagonal line that you drew Step 3. Trim the fabric above the sewn line to $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$. Repeat on the left end and press seams toward the medium fabric. Repeat for a total of 32 dark/medium units.

sew on line


Repeat on the other side


Trim to 1/4.


Press

Step 5: Arrange two light/dark half-square triangles and one dark/medium units (from Step 4) as shown below. Using a scant $1 / 4$ " seam, sew together to form a row. Press seams toward the half-square triangles. Repeat for a total of 16 rows.


Sew to each side. Make 16.

Step 6: Sew a Step 4 row to the left and right sides of a light (OR FOCUS FABRIC) 6-1/2" square, as shown below. Press seams toward the center square. Repeat for a total of 8.

sew to each side. Make 8.

Step 7: Sew a Step 5 row to the top and bottom of the block, as shown below. Press seams toward the center square. Repeat for a total of 8 "Square Dance" blocks.


Make 8
You now have 8 SQUARE DANCE blocks. Blocks should measure 10.5 " unfinished. They will measure 10 " when sewn into the quilt.

## Mystery Quilt \# 1

## Welcome to the Four th installment of Mystery Quilt \# 1!

Block1-Part 4 -You will be using fabric \#10 in this step.
Step 1:-Cut (3) strips, measuring $31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ by the width of the fabric.
Step 2: Sub-cut these strips into (10) segments measuring $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$


Step 3: Sew row 2(fabrics 2,3 \& 4) to row 3 (fabrics 5,6 \& 7) using a scant $1 / 4^{n}$ seam allowance, matching seams. Press.

Step 4: Sew $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 91 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip of fabric \#10 to the side of the block unit as shown using a scant $1 / 4^{n}$ seam allowance. Press.


Step 5: Sew Row \#1 (fabrics 1,2 \&3) to the top of the block unit, matching seams, using a scant $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press.
