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MAY 2020 MEETING WILL FEATURE NY BAG DESIGNER AND QUILTMAKER

Jessica VanDenburgh, of Sew Many Creations, will be the guest speaker at the guild's meeting in May. She is a rising star in the quilting world. In addition to creating patterns for bags and quilt, Jessica is also a fabric designer for Windham Fabrics and has released 2 fabric lines, Gypsy and Juniper. Jessica has also been a teacher at the Jay Peak Quilt Retreat for the past several years. Some guild members attending that retreat have taken workshops with Jessica and have made some beautiful bags.

Jessica will present a trunk show at the guild meeting on Thursday, May 7th. She'll be showing samples of many of her original bags/totes and quilts. Jessica will also be teaching a workshop on Saturday, May 9th, and on Sunday, May 10th, if there is enough interest for a 2nd workshop. During her time in Vermont, she will spend Friday, May 8th, at the Vermont Quilter's Schoolhouse in Troy, teaching an additional workshop.

The Elly Handbag and the Lainey Backpack are currently two of Jessica's most popular bags and are her newest bags. Other popular bags include the Tabitha Tote & Purse, the Lucy Crossbody, and the Cailey Handbag. All these bags are pictured below.
