SPECIAL DRAWING FOR EARLY QUILT SHOW REGISTRATIONS

The deadline for quilt registrations for the quilt show is Thursday, July 2nd, which is the date for the guild's July meeting. This earlier deadline will allow for ample time to plan a cohesive layout for the quilt contest. To register a quilt, guild members must provide one photo of the quilt and two copies of the registration form which can be found on the guild's website at http://www.commonthreadsvt.org/ctqqquiltshow.html.

To provide incentive for members to register quilts even earlier, there will be a special drawing for all members who provide the required photo and two copies of the registration form for their quilt entries by the guild meeting on Thursday, June 4th. The prize for the winner of the drawing is 3½ yards of fabric (five ½-yard cuts and one 1-yard cut) of Moda's Collections—Warmth. This reproduction fabric line is part of the Collection for a Cause effort by Moda. Proceeds for the sale of this line support Habitat for Humanity. Pictures of the fabrics and cut sizes are shown below.



If you'd like to win this beautiful bundle of reproduction fabrics, be sure to turn in your completed registration form (2 copies), along with one photo, to Rita Lehouillier at the May or June meeting. Your name will be entered into the drawing once for every quilt you register by June 4th. The winner will be drawn at the June meeting.

NEW AMISH QUILT BOOK FEATURED

With the recent acquisition of a book on Amish quilts, the guild's library totals 390 books. <u>How to Make an Amish Quilt</u>, by Rachel and Kenneth Pellman, is the newest book. It contains more than 80 beautiful patterns from the quilting heartland of America and provides all the patterns and techniques needed to make colorful Amish quilts.

It is time that we see some flowers somewhere since it is doubtful that we will be seeing any outside by the first week in May this year. So, the BOM for May is 4 Tulips, a 9 inch, but not a 9 patch, block.

- COLORS: black (solid or print) for the background. yellow for the stamen(?) and center AND any color that a tulip blooms in for the tulip
- black four $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares; four $1\frac{1}{2}$ "x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles; four 2 7/8" squares cut diagonally ; four $1\frac{1}{3}$ "x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles CUT:

tulip - four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares; four 2 7/8" squares cut diagonally

yellow - five $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

Yellow to black $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares four times. Press to the black. SEW: Sew that to black $1\frac{1}{2}$ "x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle four times. Press to the black. Should measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Sew black triangle to tulip triangle eight times. Press to the black. Trim to $2\frac{1}{2}$ ". Sew black/tulip square to tulip $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square 4 times, with tulip color to tulip color. Be sure that they are all the same. Press to the triangle. Sew other black/tulip square to the yellow/black 2½" square, with the yellow to the tulip color 4 times. Press to the tulip. Be sure that they are all the same. Now sew these 2 rectangles together matching center seams with yellow in the center 4 times to form the tulip. Press to the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " tulip square. Sew one yellow square between 2 black $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles. Press to the black. Now sew one $4\frac{1}{2}$ "x1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle between 2 tulip squares twice with the tulips pointing toward the corner of the block. Press to the black. To complete the block sew the black/yellow strip between the two tulip large rectangles matching the center seams. Press to the black.

Follow the illustration if there is some confusion following my directions. One way or the other, your May flower garden has sprung!
