### **Rope Baskets with Kate Albert**

Where: Sterling View Clubhouse

When: June 2, 2018 from 10 AM until around 4 PM.Finish time depends on how long it takes for folks to finish their basket.We will plan on a pot luck lunch break around noon.

Cost: \$150 plus travel and lodging for Kate, to be divided equally among the participants.

Kate will provide the rope (about 35 feet/basket) and necessary needles for which there will be a little more expense. She thought that would be about \$5.

We can also divide the travel and lodging expenses or pay that out of our treasury.

Supplies: Each participant will need to bring a yard of fabric (preferably a batik) cut into 1 inch strips (you want something with color on both sides) Scissors Needle nose pliers or a hemostat (medical clamp) Masking tape.

At the May meeting Donna will pass around a sign-up sheet so I can give Kate an approximate number of participants. Your potluck contribution will also be on the sign-up sheet (category).

#### **HENS AND CHICKENS**

2 colors: Beige / off white and one other color

CUT:

Off white -4 - 2 ½ X 4 ½" rectangles

6 - 27/8" squares


Blue-1-2 ½" square

2-47/8" squares - cut on diagonal

2-27/8" squares

#### <u>SEW</u>

- 1) Mark 2 Off White 2 7/8" squares on diagonal and pin right sides together to 2 blue 2 7/8" squares (see figure 1)
- 2) Sew ¼" on both sides of the pinned squares (see figure 1)
- Cut on line and press for 4 white/blue squares
- 4) Cut remaining 4 white 2 7/8" squares on diagonal for 8 triangles
- 5) Sew 2 white triangles to each side of 4 blue/white squares (see figure 3)
- Sew 1 large blue triangle to each of the blue/white triangles (see figure 3) make 4
- 7) Join 2 blue/white squares by sewing a white 2 ½ X 4 ½ "rectangle to one side of each (see figure 5) Make 2
- 8) Sew a white 2 ½"X 4 ½ rectangle to the blue 2 ½" square (see figure 6)
- 9) Sew all pieces together (see figure 6)
