



SEPTEMBER

The ifrst non-9 patch block of the month (but still 9 inches) is DOUBLE PINWHEEL. Easy to cut, easy to piece, and the only thing needed to be careful about is where they meet in the center.

COLORS: brown for the larger pinwheel

maroon/dark red for the inner pinwheel

tan to fill in the outside triangles

CUT: from red - one 5 3/4" square cut diagonally twice.

from brown - two 5 3/8" squares cut in half diagonally once.

BROWN

HAROON

MAROON

MAROON

TAN

BROWN

TAN

from tan - one 5 3/4" square cut diagonally twice.

SEW: one red triangle to one tan triangle 4 times so that they form a larger triangle, hopefully the same size as the brown triangle.

Sew one of these red/tan triangles to the brown triangle, long sides together to form a square 4 times.

Sew two of these squares together with the red to the brown two times.

Sew these two pieces together forming a red pinwheel in the center. DONE:

And only 12 pieces in the block! I think they will make a handsome quilt set on point.

Please bring your August Summer Wind blocks to the September meeting and we will do both blocks separately. I had a long jury selection day at the Newport court on August 7 and did not make the guild meeting.
