(Straight from the Food Shelf)



- Toothpaste Toothbrushes (for children, too!) Soap Shampoo Macaroni & Cheese Tuna



Stars are always good and we have an easy one for OCTOBER -- INDIAN STAR. Done, of course, in fall colors - red, orange and gold.





CUT: from gold for the star points - four 3 1/8" squares cut in half diagonally

from red - six 2 3/4" squares


from orange - one 5 3/4" square cut diagonally twice. two 2 3/4" squares

SEW: Make one four patch from two red and two orange 2 3/4" squares. Press as you wish. Make four flying geese units from one orange triangle and two gold triangles. Press the orange toward the gold points.

Lay out in a square with the red 2 3/4" squares in the corners, four patch in the center keeping the red squares in a diagonal line with the corner red squares, and the flying goose units in the center of the sides with the orange to the outside.

Sew one red square to each gold side of a flying goose unit twice. Press to the red square. Sew a flying goose to the opposite sides of the four patch, keeping in mind the placement of the red squares. Press the flying geese to the center. Sew the rows together matching seams and centers and it becomes INDIAN STAR.

Surely this will amke a bright, happy quilt!
