


AUTUMN

Figured Fabric


- 1) Cut 2 3" squares
- 2) Cut 3 5 1/2" squares

Plain Fabric


- 3) Cut 4 5 1/2" X 3" rectangle
- 4) Sew 13" square to 1 5 1/2 " rectangle twice to make 2 long rectangles
 (A)



5) Sew 1-5 ½ inch rectangle to both ends of 1-5 ½ inch square (B)



6) Sew both piece A to piece B Pressthe seams toward the A pieces



7) Sew remaining Squares to corners of A B Piece

Hint-

I pinned the squares to the front, but turned the piece over and drew a line on the back for stitching.

8) Cut the corner pieces ¼ inch from stitch line. Turn and Iron
