Materials:

9" X WOF main fabric
18" X WOF coordinating fabric
Fabric for prairie points (optional)

BOOKMARK



Materials:

Two coordinating fabric strips
Heat n Bond Ultrahold
Ribbon
Pinking shears or rotary cutter with pinking blade

BOWL COZY



Materials:

2 pieces of fabric, cut into 9" – 10" squares
2 pieces of batting, cut into 9" squares
Temporary spray adhesive
NOTE: If you plan to use bowl cozy in the microwave, the fabric, batting, and thread used must all be 100% cotton.

BUTTON WREATH ORNAMENT



Materials:

Variety of buttons
Felt or cardstock paper for ring base
Ribbon
Glue

CHICKEN PINCUSHION



Materials:

2 pieces of fabric, cut into same size square (usually around 5 inches)
1½" fabric square for the beak
2½" fabric square for the tail
1¼ " X 2½ " fabric strip for the comb
2 black beads or pins with black heads for the eyes
Crushed walnut shells for filling
NOTE: You can substitute quilt blocks for the larger fabric squares.
Log cabin blocks work well for this project.

CUFFED THREAD CATCHER



Materials:

Two 18" fabric squares for the exterior
Two 18" fabric squares for the interior
Two 18" squares of sturdy fusible interfacing
NOTE: The second tutorial below also includes instructions for adding a pincushion to the thread catcher.

DOUGHNUT PINCUSHION



Materials:

Two pieces of brown wool
One piece of pink wool
Matching embroidery floss or thread
Variety of colored embroidery thread for sprinkles (optional)
Batting to stuff doughnut
Template for the doughnut and icing (a CD or DVD works well for this, just cut the interior holes slightly larger)

EMBROIDERY HOOP ORNAMENT



Materials:

One 3" wooden embroidery hoop
Variety of Christmas fabric strips (can use one piece of fabric)
3" circle of felt or cardstock paper
Ribbon
Glue
NOTE: A 5" square of fabric will cover the 3" embroidery hoop with some leftover the edge. Also, I added a ribbon bow and ribbon strip to hang the ornament.

Materials:

Two squares of coordinating fabrics cut 8½"
1¼ yard narrow ribbon

FABRIC KEY FOB



Materials:

Two strips of coordinating fabrics cut 3" X 14" (One is the inner fabric and the other is the outer fabric.)
One strip of inner fabric cut 2½" X 3"
Fusible fleece or heavyweight interfacing cut ¾" X 13"
Snap hook or swivel hook

Five 5-inch fabric squares

Materials:

Three fat quarters of coordinating fabric

NOTE: I folded 2 of the fat quarters in half and cut them to the appropriate measurement. The folded edge would be the hemmed edge in the tutorial.

Sashing fabric
Border fabric
5-inch half-hexi template

Materials:

Variety of buttons
Christmas fabric
Heat n Bond Ultrahold
Ribbon
Pigma Markers
Glue

MASON JAR SEWING KIT



Materials:

Small Mason jar
One 5" square of fabric
Fiber fill (or polyester batting)
Cardstock paper or felt
Glue

NOTE: I glued the fabric top to the inside of the jar ring by putting glue on the lip of the ring and then screwing the lid and ring onto the jar. Let glue dry before opening the jar.

Two 18" squares of coordinating fabric for each napkin

PILLOWCASE



Materials:

9" X WOF fabric strip for pillowcase cuff
27" X WOF fabric piece for pillowcase body
3" X WOF fabric strip for accent strip

NOTE: This pillowcase is sometimes called the hot diggity dog, burrito, or taco pillowcase for the technique used to make it.

Materials:

Christmas fabric
Ribbon

QUICK NEEDLE MINDER



Materials:

One 2½" X 5¾" strip of cardstock or scrapbook paper
One 2½" square of cotton batting
Stapler

MINI QUILT BLOCK MAGNET



Materials:

Mini quilt blocks
Small piece of backing fabric
Small piece of batting

NOTE: Instead of batting, I layered a piece of cardstock on the back of the magnet. My magnet was layered with the mini quilt block on top, the backing fabric with right side up in the middle, and the piece of cardstock on bottom. I found it gave more stability to the mini block.

REVERSIBLE FABRIC BOWL COVER



Materials:

Two fabric squares cut diameter of bowl plus 7 inches
¼" elastic cut 4-5 inches smaller than circumference of bowl edge

ROTARY CUTTER CASE



Materials:

Two coordinating fabric pieces cut 8½" X 10"

One piece of batting cut 8½" X 10"

Button

Binding fabric (optional)

NOTE: My sample was not quilted and did not include the binding fabric. Instead I sewed around the top and sides of the pattern leaving the bottom open. I turned the fabrics and batting right side out and smoothed and pressed the seam. I then folded and overlapped the sides with right sides together and sewed across the bottom. I then turned the case right side out and attached 1 button.

SCANDINAVIAN FOLDED FABRIC STAR



Materials:

Four fabric strips cut 3" X 12 - 14"

Embroidery floss or ribbon for hanger loop

SCISSORS CASE



Materials:

Two 7" squares of coordinating fabrics

One 7" square of light to medium weight batting

36" of binding fabric cut 2" wide and pressed in half lengthwise

Small ponytail elastic band (optional)

Button (optional)

¼" wide Steam-a-Seam fusible (optional)

NOTE: I used 5" squares for my sample. I needed about 26" of binding.

Materials:

Scrabble letters

Craft popsicle stick OR cardstock paper

Ribbon

Glue

SCRAP FABRIC CHRISTMAS TREE



Materials:

Variety of fabric strips cut $\frac{3}{4}$ " X 9"

6-inch cinnamon stick

Yellow star or plain button

Twine

Glue

NOTE: Use fabrics which do not have a distinct wrong side such as homespuns, batiks or solid fabrics.

Materials:

Two fabric squares cut 4"

Two larger coordinating pieces of fabric (size depend on size of bag)

Carpenter's metal measuring tape

SURGICAL HAT



Materials:

Fabric for surgical hat cut 27" by $\frac{1}{2}$ WOF (21" – 22")

Inexpensive muslin cut 27" by $\frac{1}{2}$ WOF (21" – 22")

$\frac{1}{4}$ -inch elastic (cut to fit wearer's head snugly plus 1 inch; should be around 20" – 22")

TREE ORNAMENT



Materials:

One 8" circle of inner fabric

One 8" circle of outer fabric

One 8" circle of lightweight fusible interfacing (optional)

Ribbon or other trim for hanging loop

Star button or similar trim (optional)

TREE NAPKIN



Materials:

One piece of inner fabric cut 9" X 18"

One piece of outer fabric cut 9" X 18"

NOTE: I cut an 18" square out of the inner and outer fabrics and drew an 18" circle on the wrong side of lightest fabric. After layering the fabrics wrong sides together, I then sewed on the line around the entire circle and cut it in half to make 2 napkins. Once cut in half, sew the straight side leaving an opening in the sewn line to turn the napkin right side out.

Red and white striped fabric cut 3" X 7½"

Red or white buttons

Red ribbon

Twine or cord

Lollipop Stick

2½" square of poster board
