



FEATURED THIS MONTH: RECENT ACQUISITIONS

The following books were added to the quilt's library in November. **Baby & Kids Quilts**

<u>Workbasket:</u> and <u>Strip-Smart Quilts</u>. Here is a brief description of each of this month's featured books.

<u>Baby & Kids Quilts by Marianne Fons and Liz Porter</u> is a charming collection of quilts for toddlers to teens. It features more than 30 of the best quilts from Fons & Porter's Love of Quilting magazine and special issues of Baby Quilts, Kids Quilts, and Easy Quilts. Each quilt includes and assembly diagram, accompanied by a complete materials list and step-by-step instructions. there are projects for all skill levels, as well as styles from soft and sweet to bold and bright. *Description/review from Amazon.com*

<u>Jelly Roll Quilt Magic by Kimberly Einmo</u> introduces an entirely new design sense in this book, which really is a "magical" approach to using precuts. Einmo also introduces a 'shopping list' concept to make prepping for sewing a snap leaving more time for creating, sewing and quilting! Finally, Einmo experimented using precuts in a Round Robin exchange with international quilting friends. The idea and the results are amazing. This book will fuel quilt quild projects and challenges for years to come. *Description/review from Amazon.com*

Redwork from the Workbasket: 100 Vintage Designs by Rebecca Kemp Brent makes it easy to re-create the warm, nostalgic feel of vintage redwork designs on your linens, aprons, even quilts, whether you embroider by hand or machine. It includes a CD so that you can choose hand or machine embroidery. There is an amazing collection of designs and instructions featuring old-fashioned redwork, but a quilter can either trace the pattern to be hand sewn, or use the included CD for the designs to be stitched using your embroidery machine. <u>Strip-Smart Quilts:</u> 16 Designs from One Easy Technique by Kathy Brown features patterns which are very detailed and easy to understand. There are easy-to-read diagrams to guide you through each step. The quilts are quick and easy and make excellent use of jelly rolls and honeybuns. Highly recommended for those who love using jelly rolls! *Description/review from Amazon.com*.




Our donation to the NYC firemen

We will do another one later in the


year to include those who can't make it to the January meeting.








12 IN 2012 CHALLENGE

FINISH YOUR PHD IN 2013 CHALLENGE

The January guild meeting marks the start of the Finish Your PhD in 2013 Challenge. To participate, you'll need to find all your PhD's and decide which ones you want to finish this year. Fill out the entry form which can also be fund online at http://www.commonthreadsvt.org/phdchallenge.pdf and bring it to the January meeting. You also need to bring two fat quarters as an entry fee to join the challenge. Sharon Perry will have additional applications available at the January meeting if you cannon access ()or have trouble accessing) the application online.

Every month, from January to December, you must bring at least one completed project and show it during Show and Tell so Sharon can take a picture. The 13th completed project can be finished and shown anytime during 2013...it's your choice.

For every month you bring a completed project on your PhD list, you'll enter your name <u>twice</u> for the monthly drawing. In December, every guild member who has "met the challenge" and Finished Your PhD in 2013 (on time) by December will get to enter a special drawing for a "fabulous" grand prize.

Here are a few qualifiers:

- 1. If you're fortunate enough <u>not</u> to have 13 PhDs collecting dust, then decide on 13 projects you'd like to complete in 2013 year and bring a finished project every month, plus one additional anytime during the year, for Show and Tell.
- 2. If you have more than 13 PhDs you'd like to complete, fill out as many entry forms as you need. For every PhD completed above and beyond your 13 PhDs, you can enter your name **once** for the monthly drawing. As a note, each member only has to provide two fat quarters to enter no matter how many entry forms you fill out.
- 3. If you happen to miss a meeting (or several because you "snow bird" in a warmer climate), your completed projects will be considered finished "on time" as long as you bring all to the next meeting you attend. As an example, it you miss the March meeting, you must bring two completed PhDs to the April meeting (one for March and one for April). Or it you miss the February, March and April meeting, you must bring 4 completed PhDs to the May meeting.

As a final point, this challenge is all about completing some of those projects half done you have "cluttering" your sewing room and having fun along the way. So go clean out your sewing room and pull out all your PhDs...you just might be surprised how many you find.
