In June we will have a demo of a 60 degree table runner. In July there will be a Potluck and Bingo game. for the August meeting, the teacup auction will occur.

On Friday, September 5, 2014, Jane will hold a class on dyeing. The cost will be \$40 and she will provide all the materials, dyes and a tee shirt.

# Maple Cream Pudding

2 eggs, separated 3/4 cup maple syrup 2 T cornstarch 1/4 tsp salt 2 cups milk 1 tsp vanilla

Place egg yolks in top of double boiler and beat slightly. Add maple syrup, cornstarch and salt. Mix. Add milk and cook until thick, stirring constantly. Add vanilla, remove from heat, and cool. (Takes about 45 min.) fold in stiffly beaten egg whites and chill. Top with whipped cream (and chopped walnuts if desired).

Hospital birthing center 38" x 38" up to 40" x 40" Lap quilt in all themes; men, women, children 42" x 50" Twin 65" - 72" wide x 90" - 100" long Full/Queen 90" - 92" wide x 98" - 104" long These are approximate sizes.

The size that we use the most of right now is the lap size



Please remember to put your name in finished kits, tops and quilts that you bring in so that you are eligible for the prizes - also, if you use your own fabric for a quilt top just write 'my stash' so you get the extra credit.

### QUILTING REFERENCE BOOKS

After checking all the library holdings and deleting duplicate book entries on the list, the guild's library holdings now stand corrected at 356 books. Thanks to a donation from Aline Sweet, we recently added <u>The Art of Classic Quiltmaking</u> by Harriet Hargrave, to the library.

In addition to hundreds of books with general quiltmaking instructions and quilt patterns, the library also features some well-known reference books about quilting. These books

include: A People and Their Quilts by John Rice Irwin; Art of the Needle: 100 Masterpiece Quilts from the Shelburne Museum by Henry Joyce: Classic American Patchwork Quilt Patterns by Maggie Malone; Color: The Quilter's Guide by Christine Barnes; Dear Jane: The 225 Patterns from the Jane A. Stickle Quilt by Brenda Manges Papadakis; Designing Tesselations: The Secrets of Interlocking Patterns by Jinny Beyer; Encyclopedia of Appliqué by Barbara Brackman; Folk Art Quilts: 20 Unique Designs from the American Museum in Britain by Anne Hulbert and Sheila Betterton; Home on the Plains: Quilts and the Sod House Experience by Kathleen L. Moore and Stephanie Grace Whitson; Plain and Fancy: Vermont's People and Their Quilts As a Reflection of America by Richard L. Cleveland and Donna Bister; Quilted Planet: A Source Book of Quilts from Around the World by Celia Eddy; Quilts 1989 by the Metropolitan Museum of Art; The Classic American Quilt Collection: Amish by Rodale Press; and Voices of the Past: A History of Women's Lives in Patchwork Volume 11 by Kaye England.
