Recipe Corner

TORTELLINI SALAD

18 ounces cheese tortellini

Homemade Italian dressing (recipe below)

2 cups halved cherry tomatoes

1 14-ounce can artichoke hearts, drained and chopped

1 cup cooked white beans, drained and rinsed

½ cup thinly sliced red onion

5 pepperoncini, stemmed and chopped

2 cups fresh arugula

1 cup fresh basil, torn, plus more for garnish

Parmesan or pecorino cheese, optional

Red pepper flakes, optional

Cook the tortellini according to the package directions until al dente. Drain and let cool.

In a large bowl, combine the tortellini, tomatoes, artichokes, beans, onion, pepperoncini, and the dressing and toss to combine. Add the arugula and basil and toss again.

Season to taste, and add Parmesan and red pepper flakes, if desired. Garnish with more fresh basil. Serve right away or store in the fridge for up to 4 days.

HOMEMADE ITALIAN DRESSING

1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil

2 tablespoons white wine vinegar

2 tablespoons lemon juice

1 tablespoon finely chopped fresh parsley

1 teaspoon honey or maple syrup

1 teaspoon dried oregano

1 garlic clove, grated

½ teaspoon Dijon mustard

½ teaspoon thyme

¼ teaspoon sea salt

Freshly ground black pepper

2 tablespoons Parmesan cheese, optional

In a small bowl, whisk together the oil, vinegar, lemon juice, parsley, honey (or maple syrup), oregano, garlic, mustard, thyme, salt, and pepper.

GREEK SALAD

Dressing:

½ cup extra-virgin olive oil

3 tablespoons red wine vinegar

1 garlic clove, minced

½ teaspoon dried oregano, more for sprinkling

¼ teaspoon Dijon mustard

¼ teaspoon sea salt

Freshly ground black pepper

Salad:

1 English cucumber, sliced ¼-inch thick

1 green bell pepper, chopped into 1-inch pieces

2 cups halved cherry tomatoes

5 ounces feta cheese, cut into ½ inch cubes*

 $\frac{1}{3}$ cup thinly sliced red onion

1/3 cup pitted Kalamata olives

1/3 cup fresh mint leaves

Make the dressing: In a small bowl, whisk together the olive oil, vinegar, garlic, oregano, mustard, salt, and several grinds of pepper.

On a large platter, arrange the cucumber, green pepper, cherry tomatoes, feta cheese, red onions, and olives. Drizzle with the dressing and very gently toss. Sprinkle with a few generous pinches of oregano and top with the mint leaves. Season to taste and serve.

Notes:

*Feta in brine is best for this recipe.

CLASSIC CHICKEN SALAD

2 cups cooked chicken chopped or shredded

½ cup mayonnaise

1 rib celery, finely diced and chopped

1 green onion, thinly sliced (or chives or finely diced red onion)

1 teaspoon Dijon mustard

½ teaspoon seasoned salt

1/8 teaspoon black pepper or to taste

1 teaspoon chopped fresh dill optional

Add all ingredients to a medium bowl. Mix well to combine.

Taste and season with additional salt and pepper if desired. Serve as a sandwich or over salad.

MAPLE BALSAMIC VINAIGRETTE

1 teaspoon dry mustard

½ teaspoon dried basil

3 tablespoons balsamic vinegar

2 tablespoons maple syrup

1 tablespoon lemon juice

1 clove garlic, minced

1 cup extra virgin olive oil

1 teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon freshly ground pepper

In a small bowl, combine mustard, basil, garlic, salt, and pepper. Add vinegar, maple syrup and lemon juice. Whisk together. Add olive oil and whisk until emulsified.

2 TIPS FOR CHOOSING A COLOR PALETTE

- Start with a photo that you love, whether it's
 one you've taken or one you've seen online.
 These photos can be from your vacations, from
 magazines or advertisements, or artwork. If
 you find yourself drawn to a particular image
 because of the color palette, try pulling
 together fabrics that are similar.
- Use a multicolor fabric print to pull together colors. Whether you plan to use the particular print in your quilt or simply use it for color inspiration, it gets you started. The fabric designer already did the work of creating a color palette for you! Use the colors from the fabric to pull a palette of your own.
