She has been crafting since she was a young child, and taught herself to dye wool in 2004 after developing an interest in rug hooking. She started dyeing more wool than she could use so sold the extra on eBay. She got such a customer following that she started her own website and now sells wool and kits all over the world. She is hoping to open her own shop this fall.

Phyllis will talk about the whole appliqué process from selecting the wool to the finished project. She will have finished display pieces showing the different techniques such as stitching, embellishments and thread types.

She will be bring for sale, wool pieces in yardage (1/16, 1/8), wool bundles, appliqué kits, patterns and books. She has a website - winterberrycabin.com - where you can go and see what she has to offer. I'm sure if you see something you like, you could email her to bring it for you.

Phyllis is really looking forward to being with us. Her mother. who is a quilter. will be with her. Please come out and support her and bring a friend with you.

We will have at least 2 prizes: One for the person who contributes the most to the project - we will count the names in the box: the second prize will be a random drawing from the box.

One of the prizes is a 5 pack of rotary blades! Cut and sew to win! any colors will do - use up odd pieces of scrap that you have. We will put together beautiful "scrappy" Sunshine quilts!

This will certainly help make a dent in the 100+ quilts that we give away every year.

Featured this Month: Books For Christmas Gifts and Projects

With Christmas and the Holidays just around the corner (only 100 shopping days left!!!), this month's Book Nook will feature books in the guild's library which provide projects with a Christmas theme or for making Christmas gifts. Janet Vaupel recently donated over a dozen books to the library. Several had a Christmas theme. thanks you, Janet, for your very generous donation to the guild's library and for the inspiration for this month's featured books. Here's a quick description/review of each book:

<u>Christmas Delights: Quilts That Celebrate the Season</u>. by Jaynette Huff: "Make some holiday magic with this book! If you can sew a straight line, you can deck the halls with paper-pieced quilts for the holidays. This collection of festive blocks and quilts is perfect for quick Christmas gifts and home decor. Choose from 13 quilt patterns plus 16 blocks that you can turn into small wall hangings, large sampler quilts, or anything in between. Fun motifs include a toy soldier, nutcracker, gingerbread house-even Santa in his long johns. Oversized characters are presented on pullout pattern sheets for sewing ease." *Review from Amazon.com*

Christmas Stitchery, by Jenny Chippindale: "Using all the traditional shapes and symbols of Christmas - hearts, stars, snowflakes and birds - this book aims to show the basic needle skills required to complete the projects in this collection. A few projects do involve advanced techniques such as free machine embroidery, Patchwork, crochet, and counted cross stitch are just a few of the needlecrafts included. The materials used are as varied as the techniques and include silk, velvet, felt, string and thread. Projects range from wall-hangings, tree decorations, bird trees, and Christmas stockings." *Review from Amazon.com*

Last-Minute Christmas Gifts by Carol Taylor: "Give family and friends special handmade Christmas gifts that don't need to be started months in advance. These 60 great-looking, distinctive projects will solve your Christmas gift-list problem faster than Santa's reindeer can fly. Some take only about 1- minutes, and you don't need special craft skills or unusual materials. Pick up plants and potting soil to construct a living garden of succulents. build a simple CD rack. <u>Quilted for Christmas</u>, <u>Quilted for Christmas III</u> and <u>Quilted for Christmas IV</u>. by Christine Barnes: "Celebrate the joy of the season with a medley of festive full-size quilts, wall hangings, and a tree skirt in three books from a multi-book series. Instructions for a variety of construction techniques are featured. The series contains patch-

work projects with holiday themes. The books feature small quilts suitable for use as wall hangings or throws plus stocking patterns and a set of single-block potholders. Several fold-out sheets with full-size patterns are included as well as smaller patterns with the projects." *Review from Amazon.com*

<u>Two-Hour Quilted Christmas Projects</u>, by Cheri Saffiote: "This is a light-hearted book of simple quilting projects. <u>Two-Hour Quilted Christmas Projects</u> is terrific. The items are easy and refreshing. The patterns and directions are complete. This book delivers more than expected." *Review from Amazon.com.*

301 Country Christmas Quilt Blocks. by Cheri Saffiote: "The blocks in this book reflect simplicity and primitive themes. The variety of methods used--appliqué, piecing and stitchery, and the varying size of the blocks--allow for max creativity. The charming irregularities and imperfections in the quilt blocks are wonderful! This book's strong point is that it allows for individual variation in the spirit of the homemade "country" look. A lot of the patterns could easily be transformed into paper piecing or could be done using traditional pieced quilt blocks in similar "country" fabrics. The appliqué is rough and free-form and could be customized to suit one's own taste." *Review from Amazon.com*
